

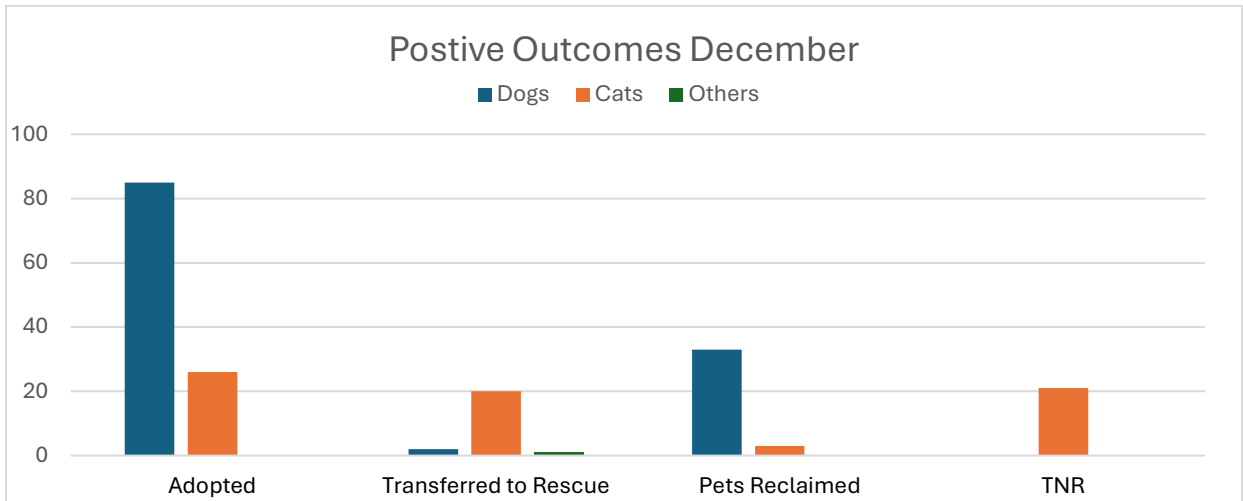

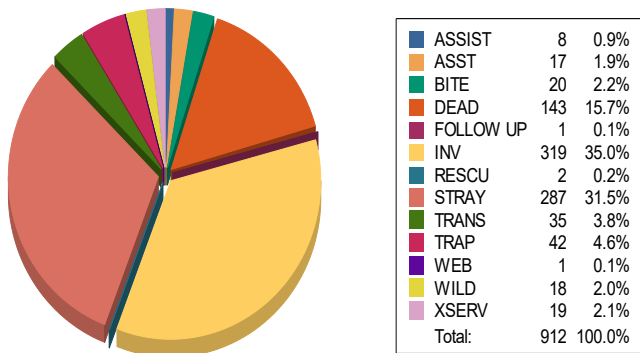

## B. Field Services

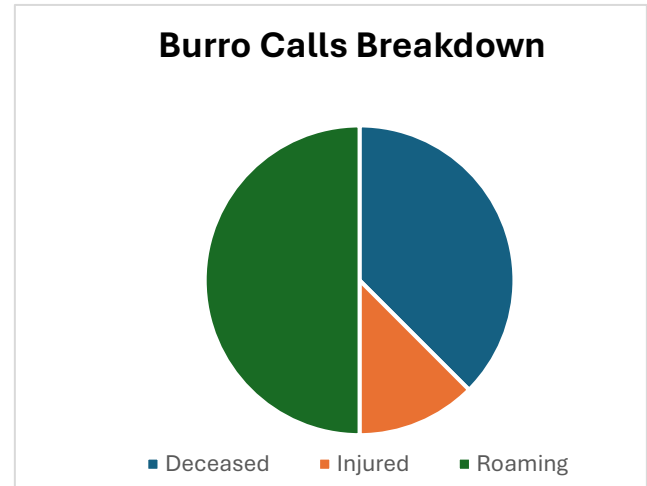
Field Services operates on a 7-day, 24-hour calls for service model based on the level of priority on all calls received. Six full-time Animal Control Officers (ACOs), one Animal License Inspector and one Field Services Supervisor currently serve the city. ACOs rotate on-call assignments in response to allied agency requests and high priority calls after hours. During normal business hours, Animal Control Officers respond to both routine and high priority service requests.

### **C. Other Activities**

#### FREE HomeAgain Microchips

- During the month of December **35 pets** owned by Moreno Valley residents received a free microchip with lifetime registration at the Animal Shelter.

#### First Ride Free Program

- Grant funds from *U.C Davis/Cal for All Animals* cover first time impound fees for owners reclaiming their lost pet.
  - **36 pets** returned home utilizing these grant funds during December.

#### Home for the Holidays Adoption Event

- **40 pets** were adopted during this low-cost pet adoption event that ran December 10<sup>th</sup> -14<sup>th</sup>. The adoption fees, \$50 for dogs and \$15 for cats, included spay-neuter surgery, vaccinations and a microchip with lifetime registration.

### **D. Upcoming Events**

#### Sweet Paws Pet Adoption Event

- This annual low-cost pet adoption event will run February 11<sup>th</sup>– 15<sup>th</sup>. The adoption fees, \$50 for dogs and \$15 for cats, include spay-neuter surgery, vaccinations and a microchip with lifetime registration.

#### United Activists for Animal Rights \$125k Donation

- The first set of spay/neuter vouchers will be distributed in February for residents, who meet Riverside County HUD income guidelines, who own medium to large dogs as outlined in the donation award letter.
