



## Support Center for City:


- **Potential incidents** (wind, rain, protest)

- **Fed, State, Regional** disaster (911, Northridge, COVID)






**CAL FIRE**

- Front line Equipment
  - 1 TDA ladder truck (T2)
  - 1 paramedic engine (E2)



# Fire Station 6 - Towngate

- Located at 22250 Eucalyptus Ave.
- Equipment
  - 1 engine (E6)
  - 1 medic squad (S6)



# Fire Station 48 – Sunnymead Ranch

- Located at 10511 Village Rd.
- Equipment
  - 1 paramedic engine (E48)





## Fire Station 58 – Moreno Beach

- Located at 28040 Eucalyptus Ave.
- Equipment
  - 1 paramedic engine (E58)



## Fire Station 65 – Kennedy Park

- Located at 15111 Indian Ave.
- Equipment
  - 1 engine (E65)
  - 1 paramedic squad (S65)
- Newest in the county, 2025



## Fire Station 91 – College Park

- Located at 16110 Lasselle St.
- Equipment
  - 1 engine (E58)
  - 1 paramedic squad (S91)

# Fire Station 99 – Morrison Park

- Located at 13400 Morrison St.
- Equipment
  - 1 paramedic engine (E99)
  - 1 Battalion Chief



# What's a Truck?

- A 'Truck' is an extra-large tool-box
- It has a 100' extension ladder
- 3k GPM pointed down on the fire
- It does not have water or a pump
- Trucks are VERY expensive (2 mil.)



**Truck 2 ladder = 100 ft.**

# What's an Engine?

---

- A 'Fire Engine' carries people, water, a pump, hose, ladders and EMS / Rescue equipment.
- 500 gallons of water
- Most versatile piece of equipment in the fleet.
- Number of engines needed is based on our values at risk.





**Why do we need  
Engines?**

**Why do we need  
hydrants?**

**2000 sq. ft. house / 3 = 600+ GPM.**

**Engine nozzles can produce 250 GPM.**


**3 hose-lines are required to put out this house  
fire**

$$\frac{(\text{Length})(\text{Width})}{3} = \text{GPM}$$




Quick, less expensive to purchase, equip, staff and maintain

ISO Fire Protection Rating Schedule-

Current rating is a 3-3X



PPS.3-1: Provide responsive, efficient, and effective police services that promotes a high level of public safety.

PPS.3-2: Provide fire prevention and emergency response services that minimize fire risks and protect life and property, including fire prevention, fire-related law enforcement, and public education and information programs.

PPS.3-3: Locate and maintain police and fire equipment, facilities, and staffing at locations and levels that allow for effective service delivery

PPS.3-4: Maintain mutual aid agreements and communication links with the County of Riverside.

PPS.3-5: Monitor the pace and location of development in Moreno Valley and coordinate the timing of fire station construction or expansion to the rise of service demand in surrounding areas.

PPS.3-6: Continue to require that new development make a fair share funding contribution to ensure the provision of adequate police and fire services.

PPS.3-7: Continue to engage the Police and Fire Departments in the development review process to ensure that projects are designed and operated in a manner that minimizes the potential for criminal activity and fire hazards and maximizes the potential for responsive police and fire services.
