CDBG PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

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| 1. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY - PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION – (951) 413-3450 | \$391,407.80 |
| | The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall CDBG grant program and reports to the Office of Housing and Urban Development on program outcomes. This includes project selection, overseeing of sub recipients, environmental reviews, invoice reviews, special studies, program reporting and monitoring of all awards. | |
| 2. | CITY OF MORENO VALLEY – PUBLIC WORKS – BAY AVENUE SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS – (951) 413-3130 | \$1,225,977.77 |
| | The Bay Avenue Sidewalk Improvement project will construct new concrete sidewalks, curbs and gutters and driveways approaches along both sides of Bay Avenue, between Day Street & Grant Street within eligible CDBG areas, to enhance ADA access and provide continuous enhanced safe paths of travel for pedestrians. | |
| 3. | ASSISTANCE LEAGUE OF RIVERSIDE- OPERATION SCHOOL BELL – (951) 682-3445 | \$15,000 |
| | Operation School Bell is a program provided to elementary, middle school and high school students with a goal of assisting them in removing barriers to learning. Since 1967 they have provided new school clothes, backpacks, school supplies, hygiene kits and reading books to homeless and economically disadvantaged children. | |
| 4. | FAMILY SERVICE ASSOCIATION (FSA) – SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM – (951) 247-1667 | \$20,000 |
| | The Senior Nutrition Program provides one nutritionally balanced meal Monday-Friday to seniors 62 years of age and older in a group setting at the Moreno Valley Senior Center. Meals are also provided through an in-home delivery service to seniors who are unable to the center because of illness, disability, or lack of transportation. | |
| 5. | FAIR HOUSING COUNCIL- ANTI-DISCRIMINATION SERVICES & LANDLORD/TENANT COUNSELING SERVICES – (951) 653-8314 | \$56,117.64 |
| | Program provides a full menu of fair housing services which affirmatively address and promote fair housing rights and obligations as defined and articulated under the Federal Fair Housing Act and the California State Law Enactments under the Rumford and Unruh Civil Rights Acts. | |
| 6. | GRID ALTERNATIVES – LOW INCOME SOLAR ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM – (951) 272-4743 | \$150,000 |
| | This project will install solar electric systems for ten low-income homeowners in Moreno Valley and will provide roof repairs to make homes "solar ready" for qualified homeowners. | |
| 7. | FRIENDS OF MORENO VALLEY SENIOR CENTER – MO-VAN SENIOR TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM – (833) 745-8454 | \$65,000 |
| | MoVan is a transportation van for twelve passengers plus 2 wheelchairs, provided Monday through Friday, 8:15 a.m-4:45 p.m. The MoVan is a safe, convenient form of transit service specially designed to meet mobility needs of Moreno Valley seniors 60 years or older and disabled adult residents. | |
| 8. | JUNIOR LEAGUE OF RIVERSIDE – DIAPER BANK OF THE INLAND EMPIRE – (951) 683-4088 | \$15,000 |
| | The Diaper Bank of the Inland Empire provides diapers/wipes to Riverside County families with limited access to basic needs. Service delivery will be held at the Junior League of Riverside's Main Office, as well as monthly pop-up distribution days in the City of Moreno Valley at community partner sites within LMI census tracts. | |
| 9. | OPERATION SAFE HOUSE – EMERGENCY SHELTER FOR YOUTH – (951) 351-4418 | \$15,000 |
| | Provides services to run away, homeless, and at-risk youth between the ages of 11-17 including up to 21 days of emergency shelter, food, counseling, on site education, street outreach, anti-human trafficking case management and aftercare. | |

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| 10. RIVERSIDE AREA RAPE CRISIS CENTER – SAFE COMMUNITIES PROJECT –(951) 686-7273 | \$15,000 |
| Safe Communities Project is a community outreach program to promote health and wellness within families and eliminate the prevalence of gender-based violence in low-to-moderate income communities. Program objectives have additionally been expanded to include gender-based violence prevention, family resiliency, and the ending of generational cycles of trauma. | |
| 11. VOICES FOR CHILDREN – COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE (CASA) PROGRAM – (951) 472-9301 | \$25,000 |
| Voices for Children’s Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program will address the needs of abused and neglected City of Moreno Valley youth in foster care by providing them with the comprehensive, individualized advocacy of a CASA volunteer in court and throughout the community. | |

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| 1. HOME PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION – (951) 413-3450 | \$62,817.40 |
| The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall HOME grant program including project selection, overseeing of sub recipients, environmental reviews, invoice reviews, special studies, all program reporting, and monitoring. | |
| 2. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY RIVERSIDE - CRITICAL HOME REPAIR PROGRAM - (951) 787-6754 | \$267,000 |
| The Critical Home Repair program (CHR) is a one-time home preservation service that offers interior and exterior repairs designed to assist low- and very low-income families living in a single-family home or mobile home secured to the permanent foundation as their primary residence within the city limit of Moreno Valley. The interior repairs consist of electrical, plumbing, flooring, wall repairs, kitchen repairs, termite work, air conditioning, insulation, bath repairs, heating and furnaces, ceiling, and minor repairs. The exterior maintenance includes replacement or repairs of roofing, house trims, siding, awnings, steps, entrance, door, windows, porch deck, handicap access ramps, weatherization, tree removal, and any other maintenance to ensure health, safety, and code enforcement compliance. | |
| 3. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY RIVERSIDE – MOBILE HOME REPAIR PROGRAM - (951) 787-6754 | \$105,000 |
| The Mobile Home Repair program (MHR) is designed to assist low to moderate income (no more than 80% of the Median HH Income) mobile homeowners in the City of Moreno Valley with interior and exterior repairs to address substandard living conditions. Health and safety issues as well as code violations are addressed first. Exterior issues may also be addressed if they are deemed health and safety related. The Mobile Home Repair program will leverage deep relationships with business partners as well as volunteers (if applicable) to complete the repairs and upgrades while maximizing the impact of funding available. | |

| The City of Moreno Valley manages the overall ESG grant program including project selection, overseeing of sub recipients, environmental reviews, invoice reviews, special studies, all program reporting, and monitoring. | |
| 2. PATH OF LIFE MINISTRIES – EMERGENCY SHELTER – (951) 786-9048 | \$104,361 |
| Funds will support shelter operations and essential shelter services like case management, employment assistance and job training, legal services, and referrals to medical, mental health, and substance abuse providers. | |
| 3. PATH OF LIFE MINISTRIES – RAPID REHOUSING – (951) 786-9048 | \$213,191.88 |
| This project will assist unsheltered individuals and families in the City of Moreno Valley with rapid rehousing. Through case management unsheltered individuals will be placed in scattered site apartments throughout the city or county and will receive guidance to obtain permanent housing. | |
